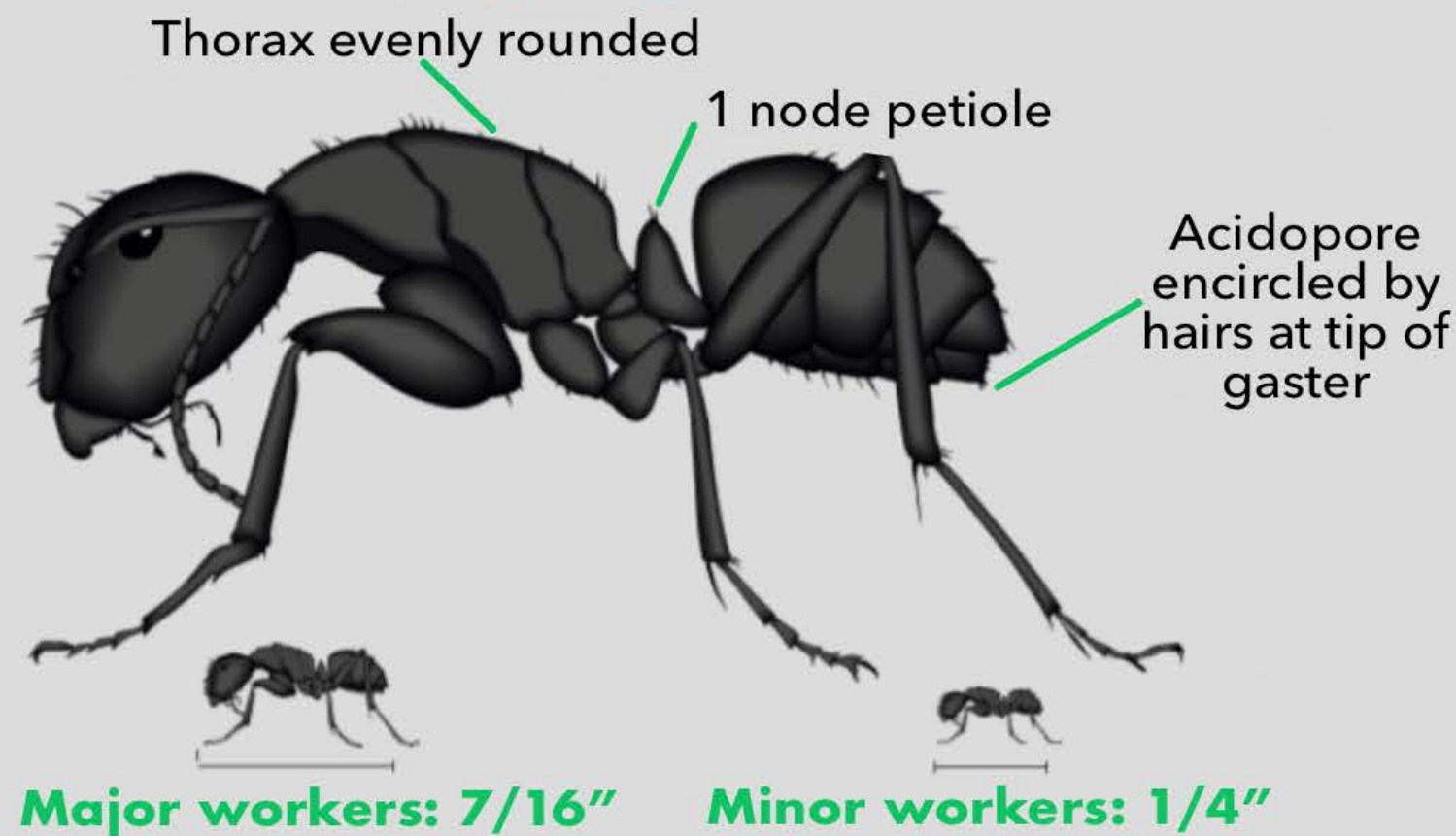


IDENTIFYING SINGLE-NODE ANTS

Camponotus pennsylvanicus

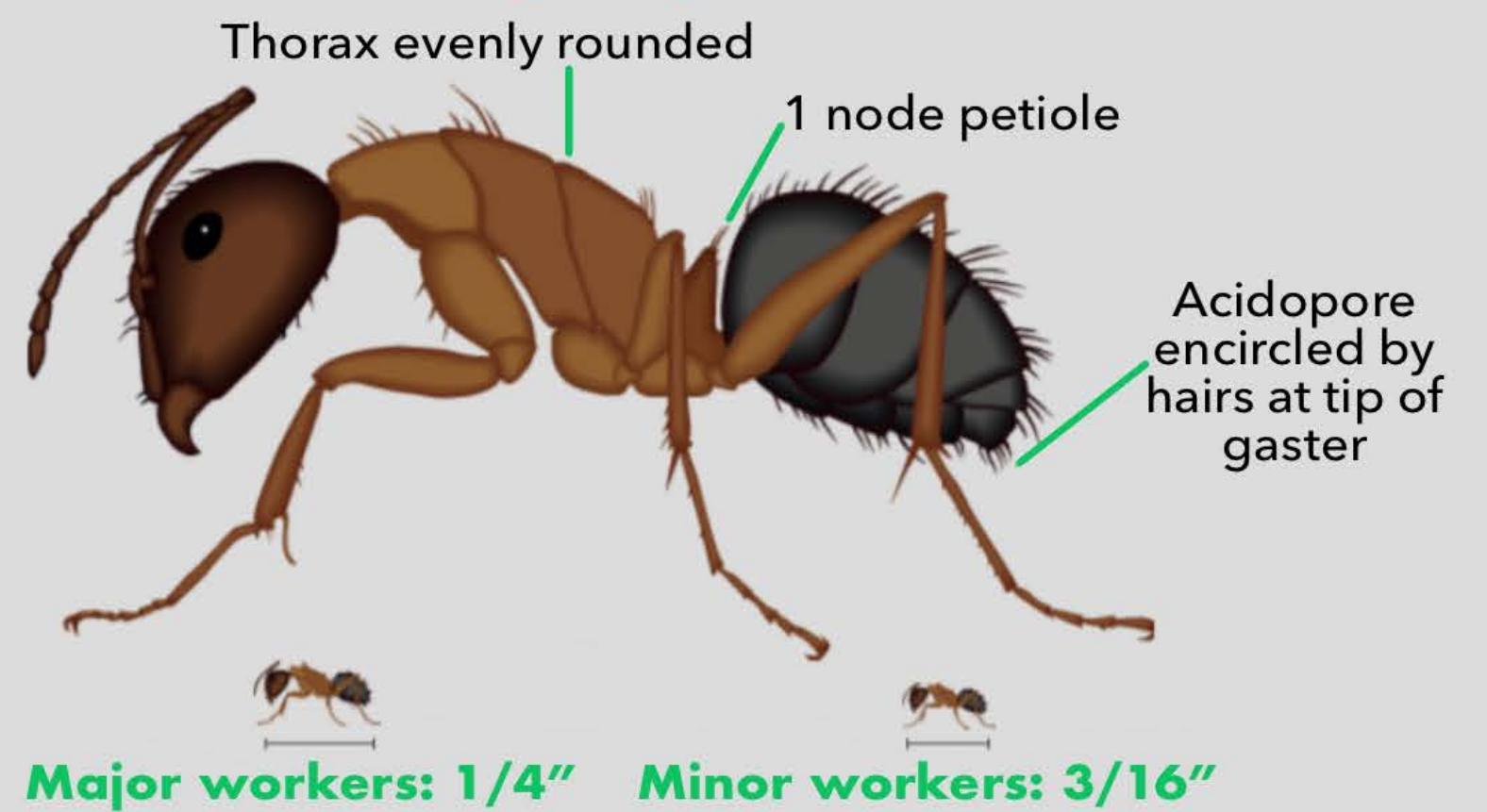
Polymorphic

Camponotus sayi

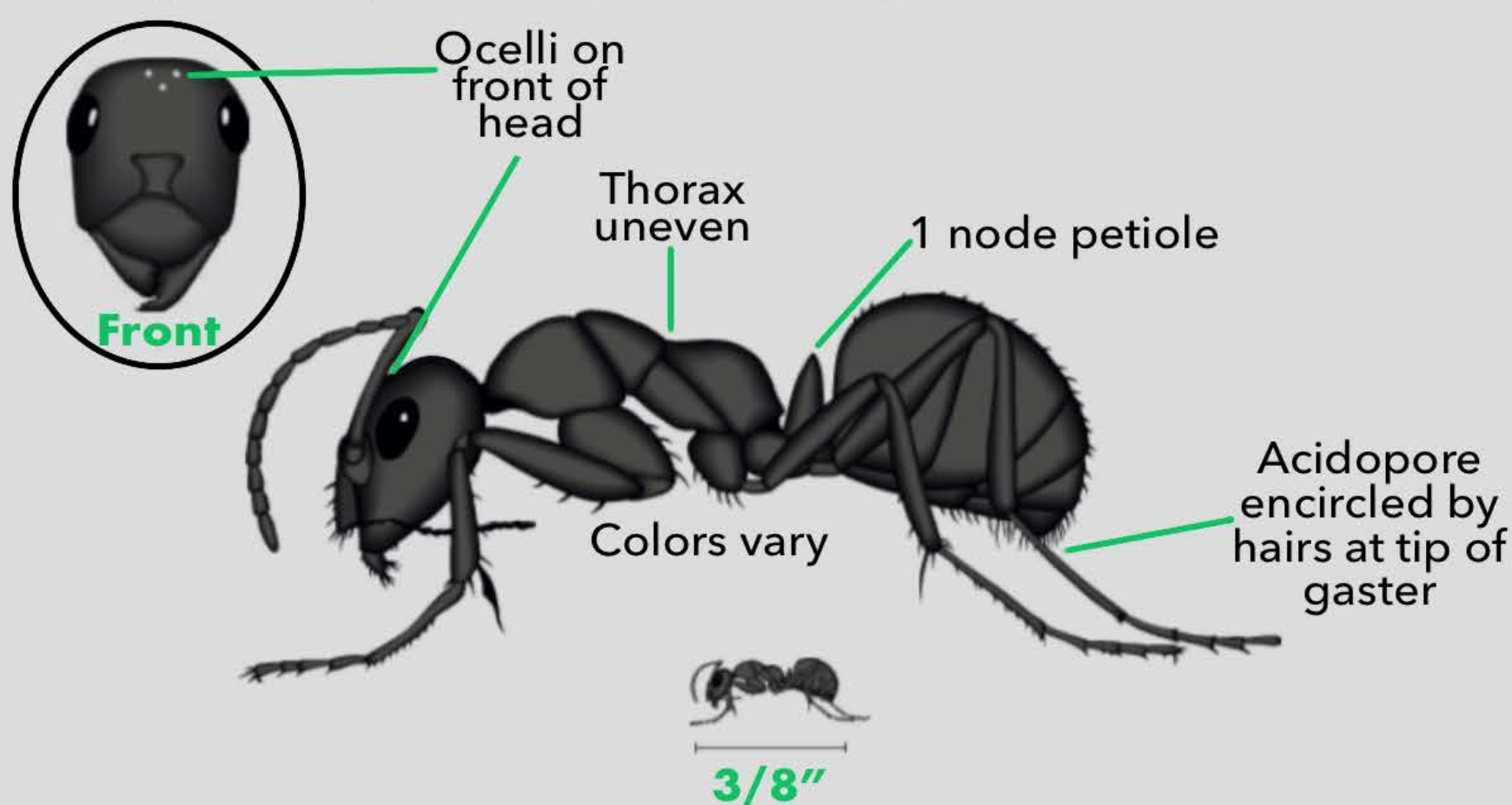
Polymorphic



Field Ant

Formica spp.

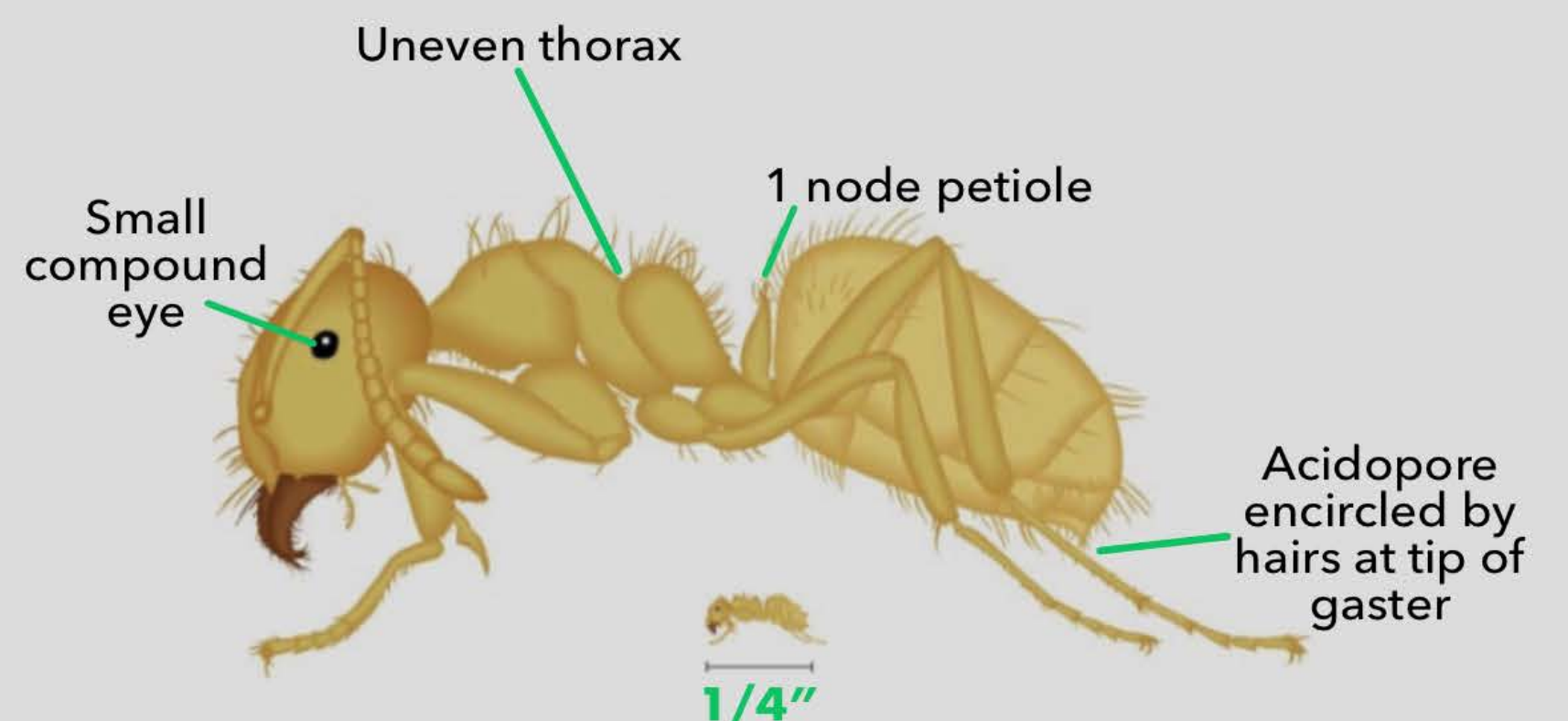
Sometimes confused with Carpenter Ants. Color may be tan, brown, red, black, or red and black



Large Yellow Ant

Acanthomyops interjectus

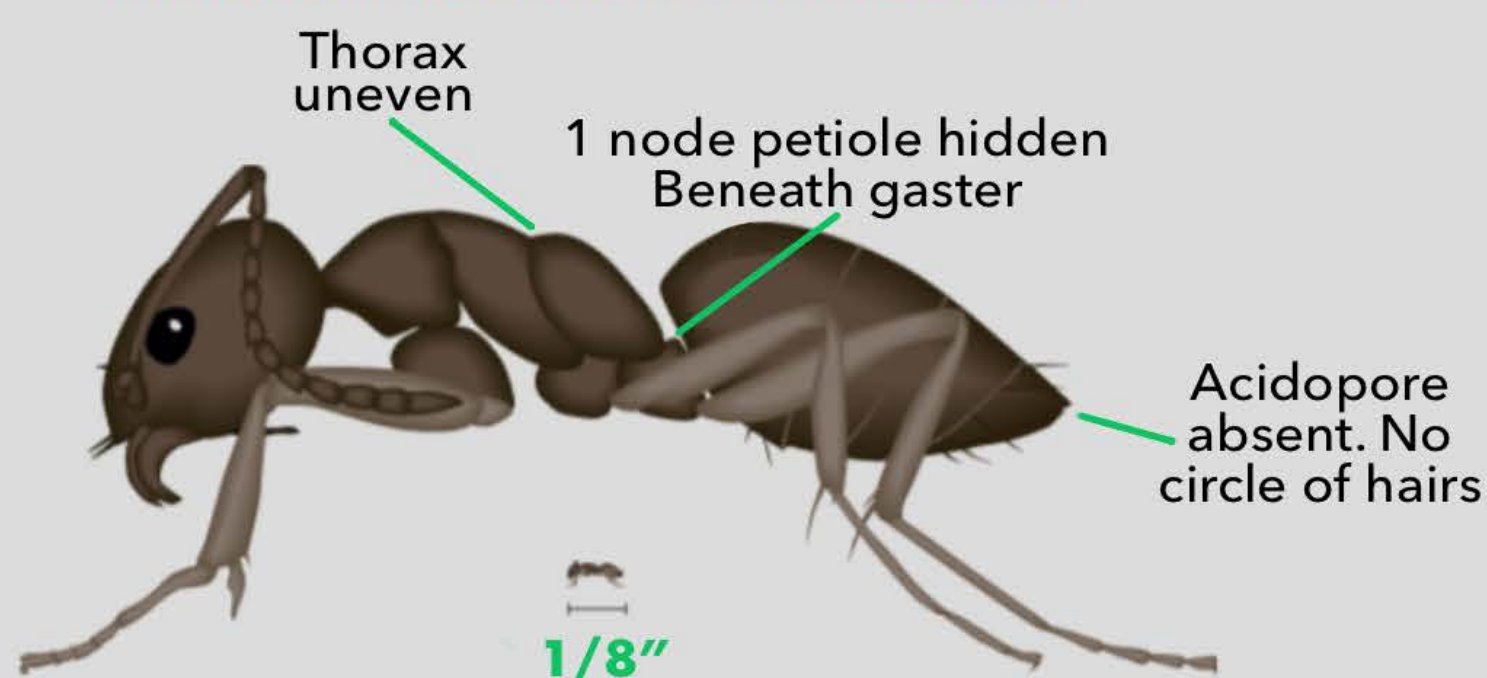
Produce a citronella-like odor when crushed, giving them their common name, “Citronella Ant”



Odorous House Ant

Tapinoma sessile

**Smells like rotten coconut when crushed
Most common ant to infest homes**



Small (False) Honey Ant

Prenolepis imparis

AKA: Winter Honey Ant. Gaster can be engorged when full of food (similar to a tick’s body)
